Student Illness

With cold and flu season fast approaching we appreciate you keeping your child home when they are experiencing illness. Below is a guideline to help determine if your child may need to be absent from school:

- When your child has been running a temperature of 100 degrees or more the night before school or in the morning
- If your child has been vomiting and/or had diarrhea at anytime during the 24 hours before school

It is our policy for students to remain at home until they are fever and/or diarrhea free for 24 hours. Please call the office by 8:00 if your child will be staying home.

Medications

All medication given at school will need the following before it will be administered:

- Release form with details signed by parent
- Medication must be in the original container with the most current prescription and date

Pain relievers, medicated cough drops, eye drops, and ointments also require a signed release form. Cough drops will be stored in the office for safety reasons. Students will not be allowed to transport medication.
