Dear Parents & Community,

I want to take this opportunity to provide a follow-up to the information I sent out on April 17 which informed you that Governor Reynolds had ordered the closing of all schools through the end of the school year to help prevent the further spread of COVID-19.

This announcement will continue to affect all Centerville Community School District programming, including before and after-school activities, all athletic and extracurricular practices and competitions and all weekend events. Consideration is being given to how the district may conduct some form of graduation ceremony. Information pertaining to a potential graduation ceremony, with social distancing being a high priority, will be forwarded at a later date.

I know this decision has caused a great deal of concern and disappointment for our students, staff, and families. The pandemic arrived quickly, and when we first were directed to close our school buildings in March, we did not realize it would be the last time we would see our students in person this school year. Please know that we share in your disappointment.

Per our district calendar, the last day of school for students is Thursday, May 28. We will continue with Home Learning until that date, just as we have over the past several weeks. We continue to encourage our families to support students in our Home Learning offerings. This will be very beneficial as we prepare students to be successful next school year. Our staff is here to help bridge this gap.

We will continue school lunch services through the extended school closure at previously established times & locations. Also, our building principals will be sending out information about scheduling dates and times for students to pick up any personal items they have left at school.

Once again, thank you for your patience, understanding, and flexibility during this difficult and unprecedented time. We will get through this together. Please continue to stay safe, practice social distancing, and remain at home as much as possible.
