A Love for Books is the First Step on the Path to Reading Success.

Research shows that the strongest readers are those who want to read, not those who are forced to read. Focus on books and reading as something to be loved, not necessarily something to be learned.

To promote a love of books and reading:

- ★ Read to your child every day.
- ★ Make reading entertaining. Use a different voice for each character.
- ★ Follow your child's lead. Every child has her own attention span for listening to a story. Your child may only be able to manage five minutes now, but they will likely want more as they get older.
 - ★ Encourage your child to look at the pictures and tell you what they think is happening.
 - ★ Let your child take control of the book. Let them hold it and turn the pages while you read.

CASE Notes: School Counseling

This month the counseling department is focusing on personal safety and pillars of character as we lead into the summer.

Students in grades 3-5 have discussed the "Always Ask First Rule", from the Second Step Child Protection Unit curriculum. We role-played and talked out situations that are realistic for students of this age and how we CAN refuse unsafe activities that put our bodies in danger.

3 BIG R's:

Recognize, Refuse, Report!!

Grades K-2 have been working on the six pillars of character:



Each pillar helps students understand core ethical values that will be used throughout their lives in everyday relationships.



Coach's Corner: Jenny Durham

In May, teachers will continue their learning with LETRS Unit 4: Advanced Decoding, Spelling, and Word Recognition. We will learn about best practices for teaching spelling, review the structure and purpose of diagnostic spelling screeners, and how to interpret spelling screener results. Teachers will continue studying about the relationship between reading fluency and reading comprehension. In addition, our training will include techniques for building word, sentence, and passage reading fluency. We will interpret phonological, phonics, spelling, and fluency data. We will deepen our understanding of how to base instructional choices on data through aligning practices with scientific evidence. The unit will wrap up with us revisiting the concept of "balance" in literacy instruction.

Math interventions continue in small groups or with individuals. Students are retaught foundational math concepts and are given many opportunities to practice their learning. Our students continue to make progress in their mathematics learning!
